The Health Statutes Amendment Act (Bill 46) required health profession regulators in Alberta to cease association activities. The College continues to receive questions from registrants regarding the differences between the roles of a Regulatory College and those of a Professional Association. This document provides clarification on the distinction between Colleges and Associations.
